RESOLUTION NO. 2022-17

RESOLUTION ADOPTING FINDINGS REGARDING SOCIAL DISTANCING AND PUBLIC HEALTH ARISING FROM THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC WHICH WARRANT THE CONTINUATION OF REMOTE (TELECONFERENCED) PUBLIC MEETINGS BY THE AUTHORITY UNDER THE BROWN ACT

- WHEREAS, the Amended and Restated Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement ("JPA Agreement") between the City of Oakland ("City") and the County of Alameda ("County") established the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum Authority ("Authority") whose powers are exercised by a Board of Commissioners ("Board") appointed by the City and the County; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Governor declared a state of emergency due to COVID-19 on March 4, 2020, which state of emergency is continuing; and
- WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 variants, which have been circulating in Alameda County and nationwide, many pandemic restrictions, including on-going recommendations for social distancing as one method to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission, remain in place; and
- WHEREAS, public meetings involve many people in shared indoor spaces for extended periods of time, where close contact raises the risk of spread of COVID-19, where there is a need to allow those who are immunocompromised or unvaccinated to participate in public meetings safely and fully, and where there remains a challenge of fully ascertaining and ensuring compliance with vaccination and other safety recommendations at such meetings; and
- WHEREAS, remote or teleconference meetings are consistent with the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OHSA) Emergency Temporary Standards requirement that employers train and instruct employees that the use of social distancing helps combat the spread of COVID-19 (8 Cal. Code Regs. 3205(c)(5)(D);
- WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021 the Governor signed into law Assembly Bill 361 (AB 361, Chapter 165, Statutes of 2021) which amended the Brown Act to allow for continued use of teleconferenced meetings by Brown Act bodies without providing a physical location for the public through January 31, 2024, under certain conditions; and
- WHEREAS, the permitting conditions in AB 361 include factors such as a continued declaration of emergency, and findings by the local legislative body every 30 days that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees or that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Commissioners does hereby resolve, declare and determine as follows:
- A. That the Authority finds that the public health, safety and welfare support continual social distancing as a result of the transmissibility of the COVID-19 virus, such that inperson meetings create a health risk.

B. That the Authority will continue to meet virtually to allow its members and members of the public to avoid exposure to COVID-19 and maintain social distancing.		
C. While meeting virtually the Authority will adhere to the applicable open meeting requirements, including those in AB 361.

- 1. Executive Director Henry Gardner summarized the budget report projected vs. actual.
- 2. General Manager Nicole Strange updated the board on per line item expenditures for the Stadium and Arena.
- 3. Executive Director Henry Gardner reviewed the continuous conversations and potential negotiation meetings with Crickett. Conversion of the field from baseball to Crickett is an important part of the discussions. This opportunity represents positive image and financial

benefits to the City of Oakland and County of Alameda. GM Nicole Strange informed the board the conversion is scheduled for December 12, 2022.

4. Executive Director Henry Gardner addressed the large number of illegal vendors on the Coliseum premises. Numerous safety concerns are associated with the illegal "hot dog" vendors in the parking lot during Coliseum events. The management team is strategizing how to address the situation.

General Manager Nicole Strange updated the board on past, current, canceled, and upcoming events. Commissioners Vukasin and Baker commended Ms. Strange and her team on the positive experiences they had after attending an concert event.

1. Men's T20 World Cup

Several representatives from the International Cricket Council (ICC) will be in Oakland on Monday, December 12 to meet with AEG staff, Commissioners of the Authority, and me to tour the Stadium and complex and surrounding area to further explore the feasibility of using the Stadium for the men's World Cup in June 2024. We have had many meetings by Zoom with the ICC leadership team over the past 3 months to explore the extraordinary opportunity for Oakland, Alameda County and the region to host the sports event that has the largest fan following in the world, second only to soccer. Our discussions to date have led to this in-person meeting.

A top priority for ICC is to test the physical feasibility of converting the field from baseball to cricket back to baseball within a specified period of time. They are also looking for expressed support from the local leadership that they will be welcomed with civic enthusiasm, recognizing we have stated repeatedly that we are not in a position to support the effort financially. Our Chairperson Nate Miley sent a letter last month stating our commitment and civic support for the event.

In order to move the efforts toward fruition, we need support and collaboration from the Oakland A's in two respects: (1) providing input and observation of a trial run to address any concerns they may have and (2) requesting from MLB adjusting the schedule in June 2024 to accommodate the cricket event. This second matter is absolutely critical to allow for the conversion to take place successfully. The parties understand that making the request of MLB is no assurance the schedule adjustment will be made but the parties are willing to proceed knowing that no certainty will be provided until the spring of 2023. To date, we have been informed that the A's have made the request for a schedule adjustment to accommodate the event but the first matter is very much in limbo. Unless the A's change their position, this opportunity will probably be lost.

2. Roots Soccer Request for Use of Malibu Lot

We are continuing to facilitate the meetings between Roots Soccer and the African American Sports and Entertainment Group (AASEG) regarding a lease with Roots Soccer for use of the Malibu lot. Roots Soccer approached us several months ago about possible use of a portion of the main complex parking lot but that proved to be impracticable from an operational point of

view. As a result, we began to explore the Malibu lot as a possible temporary site while a more permanent site is pursued by Roots, all with the goal of keeping Roots in Oakland.

It is becoming clear that given the infrastructure improvements needed and lead time to prepare the site for soccer use, a lease of much less than five years is infeasible from an investment consideration.

AASEG has taken the position that it is negotiating with the City of Oakland to purchase the City's half interest in the Coliseum complex and also plans to acquire the Malibu lot and will need the Malibu lot for staging for the construction activities on the main complex. Our understanding is that AASEG has not consummated a disposition agreement with the City for the City's fifty percent interest in the Coliseum complex and that neither the City nor the County has entered into any agreement with any party regarding disposition of the Malibu lot, which is separate from the main complex. We believe that all of this needs to be taken into consideration when estimating when the Malibu lot might be needed for staging or actual development.

We have asked the two sides to meet and come up with a proposed plan that meets both sides intended uses. The meetings are on-going. If no consensus is reached by next month, we will evaluate all intended uses, most probable time frames and make a recommendation to the Board. Any lease agreement will require the approval of the City and the County.
